Take I-68 East to Rocky Gap State Park, Exit 50. Make a left at the stop sign and cross over the bridge. The resort is visible from the road.

Directions to Allegany County Public Safety Building located at 11400 PPG Road South East, Cumberland, MD.

MIEMSS' EMSOP Quality Assurance (QA) Officer's Course (Wed. & Thurs., 8 AM – 5 PM) – Held at Allegany Department of Emergency Services in Frostburg, MD

Presenters: Sarah Sette, Assistant Attorney General; Ron Schaefer, Chief Compliance Officer; Jason Cantera, EMS Applications Coordinator, all from MIEMSS

This EMS Operational Program (EMSOP) Quality Assurance Officer Course was first introduced in 2006 to ensure EMSOPs were in compliance with COMAR Title 30 regulations. Since then, hundreds of EMS providers have completed this training, preparing them to function as EMSOP QA Officers. With input from QA Officers from across the state, this course has evolved to include these essential elements of QA/QI: due process, conducting incident inquiries, case review, and eMEDS® QA/QI. Day one will focus on the essentials of QA/QI and QA Officer regulations, roles, and responsibilities. Day two will focus on applying QA principles learned on day one, conducting incident inquiries, QI using eMEDS® reporting, and a case review workshop.

Attendees should (but not mandatory) also have a letter from their EMSOP endorsing their attendance.

The course prepares participants to assess, categorize, decide, and act early to stabilize the child. The main focus of PEARS is the assessment, recognition, and stabilization of pediatric patients at risk of severe cardiopulmonary distress. PEARS prepares participants to provide appropriate life-saving interventions within the initial minutes of a response until the child can be transferred to an advanced life support provider. *Sponsored by the Maryland EMS for Children State Partnership Grant & EMSC Program.* (7 Hrs BLS: M, ALS: NCCP Individual) **Lunch will be provided.**

Sadly, in 2018, a Sergeant was killed at the Thousand Oaks active shooter and yet another Officer was killed at Memorial Hospital in Chicago. In this class you will receive inside info on shootings that have recently happened including the Annapolis Newspaper Shooting, Pennsylvania Synagogue Shooting, the Thousand Oaks shooting and other recent events. This session will add tools to your tool box for your next Mass Casualty event or Active Assailant event.

911 STRONG – It's Time to be AWESOME!

This fast paced session will be full of great operational ideas and employee wellness ideas. PSTC is very lucky to teach nationwide and as such, we see what some of the best agencies are doing. How do they improve operational excellence? What are the best ideas for treating people and motivating people? What are the keys to Staff Wellness? Participants must be physically able to participate in this training including the adherence to or exceeding of the MFRI physical policy. (G) Triage to Thrombectomy

Endovascular Thrombectomy is now the standard of care for emergent large vessel occlusion. This session will outline best practices for ensuring patients with acute ischemic stroke are triaged appropriately, in a timely manner, and whether in the field or in a hospital are receiving the most appropriate treatment for the best possible outcome. There is will also be some “hands on” with the “squid” to see what actually takes place with a NIR patient from groin puncture to clot retrieval.

(H) Prehospital Ultrasound: Seeing is Believing

Recent developments have enabled fielding and application of durable, portable ultrasound machines for use by EMS. Relevant applications for EMS will be discussed including use of the eFAST exam, lung ultrasound, and components of a focused cardiac (echocardiogram) exam. Actual cases will be reviewed to demonstrate both normal anatomic findings and pathology.

(K) Pediatric Burns

When a burn occurs to infants, children and teens – seconds count and initial prehospital care and transport decision are key to starting the healing process. Case reviews will highlight burn percentage assessment, fluid volume resuscitation, and intentional / unintentional injury clues.

(L) Putting the Pressure On! - PEEP, CPAP, and Improving Oxygenation in Your Ventilated Patients

Presenter: David A. Miles, PhD., EMT-P, NCEE – Critical Care Paramedic, Clinical Educator

When your patient is hypoxic and struggling, just turn up the “O’s”, right? Maybe, maybe not. Discover when more oxygen doesn’t necessarily mean better oxygenation. Enhance your clinical knowledge when dealing with your patients who need advanced ventilatory support with “Putting the Pressure On!”. This presentation will outline the basics of positive end expiratory pressure (PEEP), continuous positive airway pressure (CPAP) and show how you can apply the principles of evidence-based lung protective strategy used by respiratory therapy in the critical care environment to improve your patient care in the field. Find out what you may have been doing all these years that has kept your patients alive but may not have been doing them any favors!

BONUS: Discover a little-known secret about End-Tidal CO₂ monitoring that may surprise you and challenge your knowledge of this important respiratory assessment tool!

(M) Austere Medicine and Wilderness EMS - Approach to Patient Care in Austere and Wilderness Environments

Presenter: Michael G. Millin, MD, MPH, FACEP, FAEMS, Assoc. Professor, Dept. of Emergency Medicine, Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine; Medical Director, Prince George’s County Fire/EMS Department; Executive Vice-President and Medical Director, Maryland Search and Rescue (MSAR)

During this session EMS providers will be presented with a general approach to patient care for low resource and austere environments. The presenter will pull on his expertise in wilderness EMS system development and real experiences from patient encounters in wilderness environments. The presenter will also discuss the Maryland wilderness EMS medical protocols and provide an overview of opportunities for Maryland EMS providers to get involved with wilderness EMS activities in the State of Maryland and the mid-Atlantic region.
